How To Register

1. Students may register for a class anytime during college office hours beginning April 6th until the starting date of the class. The Business Office will normally require full payment of tuition and fees at the time of registration.
2. Textbooks will be available in the Jaguar Collegiate Bookstore.
3. Students planning to enroll for ENGL1301 or MATH1314 may be subject to placement testing. Testing dates are April 15 at 2:00 pm., May 15 at 10:00 a.m., June 3 at 8:30 a.m., and July 10 at 8:30 a.m.
4. Credentials needed if not already on file:
 - a. Completed application form and \$15.00
 - b. If previous college attendance, official copies of all college transcripts; official copy of high school transcript or G.E.D. certificate for high school graduates.
 - c. Recent photograph (or clear photocopy)
 - d. Photocopy of social security card

COSTS

Tuition for regular students is \$85.00 per semester hour. For high school students who will be juniors or seniors in August, tuition is \$55.00 per semester hour. The application fee is \$15.00 for new students or former students enrolled prior to Spring 2009. The technology fee for all students is \$9.00 per semester hour. Any laboratory use fee is \$35.00 per course.

REFUNDS

Any student officially withdrawing from a class or from the college through the last day to add/drop will receive a full refund of tuition. No refund of tuition will be given after the last day to add/drop. No refund of fees will be given.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION / POLICIES

1. The last day to add a class or drop a class without a grade is the second class day of the semester.
2. The last day to withdraw from a class with a grade of "W" for the May-mester is May 26th, for Summer 1 semester the date is June 22nd, for the Summer 2 semester the date is July 27th.
3. The May-mester classes meet Monday-Friday, with the final exam on the final class day.
4. The Summer 1 and Summer 2 classes meet Monday-Thursday, with the final exam on the final class day. With one exception see note below.
